For some reason that I can't quite put my finger on, October always winds up being the busiest month of the year for me. Of course, there's a

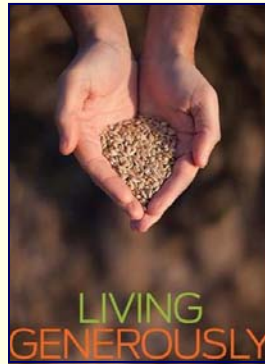

A Call To An Abundant Life



The 2017 Stewardship Drive was Kicked off in swinging fashion on September 25 with an outdoor Jazz Mass on a beautiful, early fall day. With a theme of "Living Generously," the campaign's goal is \$219,000, a 6.8% increase over 2016. The total proposed budget of \$334,909 is only slightly above last year's budget, but will draw 45% less from cash reserves than in 2016. It was announced that the Vestry and Stewardship Committee had already pledged \$38,960. The new budget includes new funding for social media advertising, a salary increase for the Parish Administrator, and continued support for outreach, multi-generational Christian education, backpack ministries, children and youth ministries and more.

UNITED THANK OFFERING (UTO) will be received Sunday, October 2, the Sunday nearest the commemoration of St. Michaels and all Angels Day. This offering was begun 125 years ago in 1891 by the women of the Episcopal Church

to help individuals pay attention to the blessings in their lives by making small thank offerings. The Little Blue Box was used by many to make daily thank offerings and given on UTO Sunday. Throughout the 19th and early 20th centuries the women organized, promoted and funded much of the missionary outreach of the Episcopal Church.

In 2015 the UTO offering awarded 55 grants for a total of \$1,588,006.85 in 36 domestic and 10 overseas dioceses. Our diocese has received grants over the years to start new ministries or to expand old. The 2016 Diocesan spring offering was \$8411.96 and will be sent to National with the fall offering by December 15.

August 15, 2016

- Marshall Jolly, Rector, opened the vestry meeting at 5:02 p.m.
- Meredith McSwain presented a devotional regarding how important speaking the truth is in life and in the Church. Not to hurt but to be honest in dealings with each other.
- A motion was made by Judy Buchly to accept the July 2016 minutes as presented. Meredith McSwain seconded. Motion passed.
- The Treasurer presented the Financial Statements. Caroline Avery made a motion to accept the Financials as presented. John Jokinen seconded. Motion passed.

Rector's Report

- Attached to minutes
- The Rector will be on vacation over the weekend of August 21st. Deacon Mike will cover the pastoral care and Father Britt will supply.
- Kickoff Sunday will be Sunday, August 28. One service followed by a Ministry Fair in the Parish Hall. There will be activities for the kids. Caroline Avery will purchase refreshments for the reception. During worship Norma, John, Mark and Jo will hold up signs.
- The Rector informed the Vestry that he has been asked to serve on two additional boards. The Department of Social Services Board and the Emergency Food & Shelter Program.

Junior Warden's Report

- Dale presented several estimates for playground equipment. After some discussion, it was decided that Dale and Meredith would research further options for metal rather than wood playground equipment.
- The estimate from Lowes for the Rectory storm door came in at \$718.95. The Vestry suggested several other places that quotes could be obtained from including Wall Lumber. Further quotes will be obtained.

OLD BUSINESS

Stewardship Committee Meredith McSwain reported that the committee had met several times. The Committee asked that the Vestry make their pledges prior to the next Vestry meeting so that the total amount could be reported to the congregation. The theme for the campaign is "Live Generously." The Stewardship Committee has asked that an on-line contribution method be considered to bring in additional funds. Tithely was suggested as one method. After discussion, it was decided that the Rector, the Treasurer and Meredith would explore the possibility of such a system and what the requirements would be

As part of its continuing concert series, Grace Church presents classical guitarist Miguel Pico on Sunday evening, October 30 at 5:00 p. m. Mr. Pico is well known in our region as the “Maestro of the classical guitar.” The concert is free to the public with a love offering accepted. All proceeds will benefit The Meeting Place Mission, which has been providing Hope and Opportunity for the homeless in Burke County since 2004.

Miguel A. Pico was born in Colombia, South America, and began studying classical guitar at the age of five, drawing on his family’s musical background. He pursued instruction under some of the most renowned guitar masters, like Gentil Montana, Abel Carlevaro and Eduardo Fernandez from South America, Francesco Biraggi from Italy, and Enric Madriguera of the United States, among others. Likewise, he pursued further training at various music academies all over South America to develop a technique that not only honors the guitar itself but produces music that flows from the instrument with clarity and quality.

generosity—three precepts that are at the core of our faith. From time to time, all of us needed to be reminded of these precepts, and I am thankful that our stewardship committee selected this year's stewardship theme, "Living Generously: A Call to an Abundant Life," with this in mind. In the coming weeks, you'll hear more about the importance of stewardship and generosity, and all of us will be asked to consider how God is calling us to live generously by making our pledge to Grace Episcopal Church for 2017.

We have a tendency to think of money in the church as something that is dirty—a "necessary evil" that we'd rather not talk about. But when we make our pledges and give our monetary of-

ferings with a joyful and generous heart, they are made holy. Each week, after the ushers have collected the monetary offerings, they bring them forward, along with simple bread and wine, to be placed on the altar of God and consecrated as our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving. Just as we receive the grain of the field and the fruit of the vine as holy food and drink, we receive the monetary offerings as holy acts of generosity, given for the spread of God's Kingdom and the building up of the Body of Christ.

In the midst of the busy-ness of life, I invite you to remember the importance of gratitude; of grace; and of generosity. I invite you to *live into* these precepts, so that we may cultivate an abundant life!

- **Delegates to Diocesan Convention** The Vestry was asked to consider candidates to attend the convention. Father Jolly has four interested parties. There needs to be two delegates selected and two alternates.

REPORT FROM THE TREASURER

As of August 30, our pledged offerings are \$143,083.96 which is at 69.7% of the budgeted amount. The amount does include some prepaid pledge amounts. The plate offerings as of August 30 are \$11,661.19, which is 62.3% of the budgeted amount. Our total expenses as of August 30 are \$222,186.98, which is 66.4% of the total budgeted expense amount. The August percentage should be 66.6%.
