VESTRY MEETING MINUTES

July 18, 2016

Handouts June 2016 Minutes, Auditor's Reports, Edward Jones Statement, Rector's Report, Morganton Warming Station

- Marshall Jolly, Rector, opened the vestry meeting at 5:03 p.m.
- Judy Buchly presented a devotional with scripture readings - Problems are a part of life - we should let them pass by and let God be our primary concern.
- A motion was made by Holly Camp to accept the June 2016 minutes as amended. John Jokinen seconded. Motion passed.
- The Treasurer reported that the financials had been delayed and would be emailed to the vestry members when available.

Finance Committee Report

- The Auditor's report had been received by the Finance Committee. He found no problems with the financials. He praised Morris Baker for the work he had done cleaning up the financial records. Vestry members were given copies to review. John Jokinen made a motion to accept the Financial Report for 2015 as presented. Judy Buchly seconded. Motion passed. Caroline Avery suggested that next year the Financial Report be made available to the Vestry for review prior to the Vestry meeting. It was suggested that copies could be made available in the office for the Vestry to pick up.
- The Finance Committee recommended that the Rector be reimbursed for his cell phone expense. The Rector will present to the Treasurer his cell phone bills on a quarterly basis to be reimbursed. A motion to approve a new line item in the budget for the cell phone expense was made by Caroline Avery. Judy Buchly seconded. Motion passed.
- On the Finance Committee's recommendation, John Jokinen made a motion to close out two Edward Jones Accounts: Account 990-03306-1-5 in the amount of \$3907.17 and Account 990-06300-1-4 in the amount of \$1.74 and transfer the funds to the Rectory Building Repair line item. Judy Buchly seconded the motion. Motion passed.
- The Finance Committee recommended that the Endowment Committee be asked to report on the Endowment Funds on a quarterly rather than yearly basis. Judy Buchly will get in touch with Nancy Taylor to request that be done.
- The Finance Committee and the Rector are working on an "End Of Life" workshop for the Parish to be held on September 11, 2016. There will be several speakers on different aspects of planning and a dinner.
- After some discussion, the Finance Committee decided that salary increases would be held off until the next Budget Session.

Junior Warden's Report

- The Rector reported for Dale. Father Jolly will get in touch with Rocky for a written estimate for the playground equipment removal. It will be either emailed to the Vestry members or presented at the next Vestry meeting.

- A small leak has been repaired. The dishwasher needs replacement, as does the kitchen cabinetry. The front porch needs power washing and painting. The Rector suggested that one room at a time be addressed. He will explore the cost of a new dishwasher and replacement kitchen cabinets and bring estimates to the Vestry.

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REPORT FROM THE TREASURER

As of July 31, our pledged offerings are \$124,884.21, which is 60.9% of the budgeted amount. The amount includes some prepaid pledge amounts. The plate offerings as of July 31 are \$9896.19, which is 52.9% of the budgeted amount. Our total expenses as of July 31 are \$202,397.12, which is 60.5% of the total budgeted expense amount. However, in July we paid a major portion of the Rectory Repair budgeted amount. The July percentage should be 58.3%.



Meals On Wheels: One Person's Story

In the first of an occasional series on parishioners who volunteer in the community, we talk to Pat Phelps about her and husband John's involvement with Meals On Wheels

GN: How did you get involved with Meals On Wheels?

Pat: During a period of particularly high gas prices, we saw in the newspaper that the local Meals on Wheels program needed volunteers. Our low-gas-using Prius seemed like a perfect car for this adventure so we volunteered; seven years later we still find it a joy. We deliver meals once a week, picking them up at the Morganton-Burke Senior Center about 10:00 a. m. We are usually back to the Center well before 11:30. We have had several different routes through the years and currently deliver in the Drexel area. We are blessed that Jean Rhodes of Grace Church is now on our route.



GN: Talk about the purpose of the organization and what it does.

Pat: Meals on Wheels, which has been in Burke County for over 20 years, provides 120 homebound or disabled seniors (over 60) a hot, nutritious meal Monday through Friday. Meals contain 1/3 of the daily caloric and nutritional needs of the clients and consist of a protein, vegetables, fruit and milk.

GN: What do you like about your work.

Pat: We truly enjoy meeting and getting to know the clients. They are invariably appreciative of the meals and our short visits. There are, of course, changes in the route as clients move or enter assisted living and we are always saddened when one dies.

GN: Talk about the people you serve.

Pat: Jean Rhodes likes that the food is more than ample and appeals to both eye and taste. She also notes, as have others, that the daily check-in is reassuring for a home-bound person.

GN: How would someone get involved with this service?

Pat: New volunteers are always welcome; many do it weekly as we do, but some churches have teams that share the responsibility across the month. Routes are available throughout the county. To volunteer call Angie at the Morganton-Burke Senior Center 430-4147.

End of Life Care Planning Workshop Coming In September

The Finance Committee has been working hard on planning an End of Life Care Planning workshop, set for Sunday, September 11 at 12 noon. We'll begin with a catered lunch, then discuss the financial, legal, medical, and pastoral aspects of planning for our future wishes. This is a difficult conversation for some, but Hugh Morgan shared eleven thoughts that remind us of just how much we need to engage this conversation. He writes: "One of the important things we can provide our loved ones as we think of life's end is a memorandum setting out the following:

1. The funeral and burial arrangements you desire.
2. Whether you have a will and, if so, the name, address, and phone number of the person who prepared your will and the location of your will.
3. Whether you have executed an Advance Directive for a Natural Death (a "Living Will"), a Power of Attorney and/or a Healthcare Power of Attorney, and the location of those documents.
4. Whether you have medical/health/prescription drug insurance and who provides it and how premiums for this coverage are paid.
5. The names, addresses and telephone numbers of your children, grandchildren and others who you would want to be notified of your death.
6. A list of the assets you own, such as a residence; other real estate; stocks, bonds, and mutual funds and where they are located; bank ac-

counts; life insurance policies; retirement plans; automobiles, boats, etc.

7. Whether you have a safe deposit box and, if so, where it is located and where you keep the key(s) to it.
 8. The names, addresses and telephone numbers of persons who advise you, such as lawyers, accountants, bankers, financial advisors, stockbrokers, insurance agents, etc.
 9. A list of your liabilities, such as a mortgage on your home, other debts you owe, any contingent debts, such as a debt of others you have guaranteed, etc.
 10. Whether you carry insurance on your home, and how to contact the person or firm providing this insurance; and the same regarding insurance on your automobile, etc.
 11. If you have pets, what are your wishes as to how they should be cared for after your death.
- There will be other things you may think of that should be added to this list, but hopefully this will provide a start. Copies of this memorandum should be delivered to each of your loved ones and, if you have a will, to the person (probably a lawyer) who prepared your will. All of this will greatly simplify things for the persons administering your estate.

to Adriana Morris, a counselor at Mountain Crest. "Items that go home, seldom find their way back to school; so we prefer to distribute the items as students need them for class work."

Here is a partial list of donations: 456 pocket folders, 200 glue sticks, 122 composition note books, 118 boxes of crayons, 111 sets of ear buds, 109 12-packs of #2 pencils, and so much more. For a complete list of items, please check the bulletin board in the Parish Hall.

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grace, and inspiration.

There's not a day that goes by here in Morganton that I don't see one of our hallmark "Welcome Regardless" signs—after all, there are about a dozen of them right outside my windows at home and at work! I love those signs, and I think that they communicate an important message about who we are and what we're about as a people called Episcopalians. But they also cause me to wonder: Once we've extended welcome to the people who come into our midst, then what? Once we've welcomed, how do we get to that deeper place that we're all seeking? How do we love one another? How do we share and receive wisdom? How do we transmit grace and inspiration? I think Solnit is right when she says that we have to "extend the boundaries of the self into unknown territory." After all, welcoming is about *our* community; *our* way of being Episcopalians; Christians; people. But love and wisdom, grace and inspiration don't work that way.

First, it's important for us to remember that we do not and we cannot *own* love, wisdom,

grace, or inspiration. They are gifts that transcend the boundaries of our understanding. Second, there's no one-size-fits-all approach. What works for me may not work for you—and that's a *good* thing! Third—and this is important as we're starting a new program year—it takes *work*! Deep conversations and discernment about the complexities of love; the many dimensions of wisdom and inspiration; and the myriad expressions of grace do not happen overnight, and they do not happen on our time.

No, this work begins at the table—the sacramental table, where we share Holy Communion, and in the deep sharing that happens in conversations around the dinner table. What are you passionate about? Where have you seen God in your life? Where have you extended and received grace? What inspires you? The answers won't all come at once. Our job is to keep coming back to the table because it is there that we begin to move into unknown territory, where God shows us wild and wonderful things!
